Framework

The Mediterranean region faces complex and interlinked challenges related to coastal and marine biodiversity conservation, legal governance, and spatial planning. Although a dense framework of international and regional agreements exists to guide conservation efforts, their implementation remains uneven. Fragmentation across governance levels, limited financial and technical resources, and insufficient cross-sectoral collaboration often hinder the effective translation of policy into action on the ground.

To address these challenges, this webinar is framed as a capacity-building activity within the <u>Interreg</u> <u>Euro-MED Mission for Natural Heritage</u>. It specifically targets members of the four Working Groups involved in the Mission, aiming to deepen their understanding of the legal and policy instruments that shape conservation efforts in the Mediterranean coastal zone.

Through a combination of knowledge-sharing and policy dialogue, this event contributes to the broader goal of developing a shared, transnational vision for effective nature and biodiversity protection. It also seeks to empower participants to influence policy processes at both regional and Euro-Mediterranean levels.

Description

The webinar will take place entirely in a plenary format, bringing together all participants in a shared space for learning and exchange. Throughout the session, experts will deliver a comprehensive and accessible overview of the main legal and policy frameworks relevant to natural heritage in the Mediterranean coastal zone. Presentations will cover the key objectives, core provisions, and practical implications of these instruments, alongside an exploration of implementation challenges.

In addition, the webinar will include a focused segment on the upcoming United Nations Ocean Conference (UNOC). This segment will inform participants about UNOC's objectives, processes, and







opportunities for representation within the Mission for Natural Heritage community.
