Description:

Organised over a two-day activity every year, the institutional dialogue aims to discuss policy challenges and promote solutions for key thematic issues relevant to the Mediterranean natural heritage. Participants will discuss obstacles, new approaches and opportunities to advocate for nature conservation in the region.

The first day of the event, **November 28**, will focus on **marine and coastal restoration**, with the afternoon session dedicated to the Spanish restoration context. This is a key discussion towards the restoration of at least 20% of the world's land and sea areas by 2030, as identified under Target 2 of the Global Biodiversity Framework. It also supports the target of 30% of terrestrial, coastal, freshwater, and marine ecosystems in good condition by 2030 under the EU Nature Restoration Law.

The second day of the event, **November 29**, will offer a **capacity-building session on the policy-science interface**. The objective is to provide insights for projects and organisations to better navigate the complexities of decision-making for nature conservation. Additionally, the Natural Heritage community of practice will have the chance to **meet, exchange ideas and identify new opportunities for collaboration**.


