


The UN Biodiversity Plan

- Adopted at COP15 in Montreal, after 4 years of negotiations (in person and online).
- The Biodiversity Plan serves as the new 10-year strategy for the UN Convention on Biological Diversity.
- It is the path to achieve the Convention's vision of *Living in Harmony with Nature*.

The UN Biodiversity Plan

- It includes 4 overarching goals to be achieved by 2050 and 23 action-oriented targets for 2030, as well as complementary sections on supporting mechanisms, responsibility, transparency, communication, and education.
- Its implementation will be guided and supported through several COP 15 decisions, including an enhanced mechanism for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing implementation.



The implementation COP

- COP16 is the first COP after the adoption of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
- The theme selected is "Peace with nature".
- It aims to finalize outstanding issues from COP15 and related to the KMGBF (e.g. resource mobilisation, the update of the NBSAPs, monitoring framework).

Updating the NBSAPs

- In decision was 15/6. on *Mechanisms for planning, monitoring, reporting* and review **Parties agreed to align their National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs) to the KMGBF.**

- The analysis of NBSAPs will happen at SBI5, just before COP16, and **the first** global review on progress will take place in 2026.
