















Working Group Goals

GBF Targets - Target 1

Target 1: Spatial Planning

Ensure that all areas are under participatory, integrated and biodiversity inclusive spatial planning and/or effective management processes addressing land- and sea-use change, to bring the loss of areas of high biodiversity importance, including ecosystems of high ecological integrity, close to zero by 2030, while respecting the rights of indigenous peoples and local communities.











GBF Targets - Target 3

Target 3: Area-based Conservation

Ensure and enable that by 2030 at least 30 percent of terrestrial and inland water areas, and of marine and coastal areas, especially areas of particular importance for biodiversity and ecosystem functions and services, are effectively conserved and managed through ecologically representative, well-connected and equitably governed systems of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, recognizing indigenous and traditional territories, where applicable, and integrated into wider landscapes, seascapes and the ocean, while ensuring that any sustainable use, where appropriate in such areas, is fully consistent with conservation outcomes, recognizing and respecting the rights of indigenous peoples and local communities, including over their traditional territories.












Interlinkages between Targets















What we heard from NRL

- National targets: 30% of areas in good condition by 2030-Priority to Natura 2000.
- Non-deterioration clause: conditions of ecosystems do not worsen
- Art. 6 and 7: **exemptions for energy use** outside N2000
- Art. 13: 3 billion trees
- Climate change impact scenarios
- National plans by 2027













What we heard from NRL / Challenges

- Governance: alignment of priorities at all scales / ensuring compliance strong enforcement
- **Financing:** secure funds complex
- Capacity: technical knowledge needed / laco of admin capacity at subnational level
- Multilevel challenge: need for cross border coordination
- Policy coherence: with environment, energy projects etc
- Stakeholder engagement: risk of opposition














