Tackle key issues concerning Protected Areas (PAs) and Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OECMs) and inform conservation strategies

GBF - Target 1

Target 1: Spatial Planning

Ensure that all areas are under participatory, integrated and biodiversity inclusive spatial planning and/or effective management processes addressing land- and sea-use change, to bring the loss of areas of high biodiversity importance, including ecosystems of high ecological integrity, close to zero by 2030, while respecting the rights of indigenous peoples and local communities.











GBF - Target 3

Target 3: Area-based Conservation

Ensure and enable that by 2030 at least 30 percent of terrestrial and inland water areas, and of marine and coastal areas, especially areas of particular importance for biodiversity and ecosystem functions and services, are effectively conserved and managed through ecologically representative, well-connected and equitably governed systems of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, recognizing indigenous and traditional territories, where applicable, and integrated into wider landscapes, seascapes and the ocean, while ensuring that any sustainable use, where appropriate in such areas, is fully consistent with conservation outcomes, recognizing and respecting the rights of indigenous peoples and local communities, including over their traditional territories.




- Policies targeted by the Working Group:

 & Target 3
 - EU: EU Biodiversity Strategy, EU Maritime Spatial Planning
 - MED: Post-2020 SAPBIO, Post-2020 Mediterranean Marine Protected Areas Roadmap












Principles to Be Followed

- All GBF targets are somehow interlinked. Discussions should ensure integration
- Many policies not directly related to this Working Group enter in contradiction with its goals (i.e. urban development) and should be monitored as well
- Harmonisation of policies should be a goal of the Working Group discussions at
 Mediterranean scale, and at the various levels of governance (i.e. country vs. cities)
- Multilevel governance, specially the local context, should be also taken into account
- Most of the time, the problem lays on implementation of policies











Themes to Be Followed (I)

- Spatial planning and intersectorial integration of conservation principles: conservation principles and sustainable use of natural resources, as well as roles within spatial planning should also be considered
- Protected areas and OECM networks: extension, representation and coherence of protection for important ecosystems/species. Connectivity, particularly in the marine domain. Transboundary connectivity for marine and terrestrial ecosystems











Themes to Be Followed? (II)

- Regional assessment of species/ecosystems and their distribution for marine and terrestrial domains: taking into account declining habitats
- Assess the effectiveness of existing protected areas: evaluating their conservation outcomes and management practices to identify improvement opportunities
- Examine opportunities and constraints for expanding PAs and OECMs in the region, including expectations of the High Ambition Coalition (HAC)











What Should We Do?

- Increase knowledge on the subject matter at all levels of governance.
 - Materials/approach should be target-specific (national vs regional vs city, etc.).
- Provide material, information, ideas, contacts, speakers and expertise to implement capacity building actions and to communicate with resources that already exist.
- Act as a platform to reward good practices and promote good work: taking into account declining habitats












Working Group Goals

- MPA4Change: Promote the transformation of MPA4Change toolkits of solutions into effective public policies in line with the EU/MED strategies via a bottom-up approach.

- Drafting yearly policy paper as WG




