GBF - Target 2

Target 2: Restoration

Ensure that by 2030 at least 30 percent of areas of degraded terrestrial, inland water, and marine and coastal ecosystems are under effective restoration, in order to enhance biodiversity and ecosystem functions and services, ecological integrity and connectivity.











GBF - Target 11

Target 11: Ecosystem services

Restore, maintain and enhance nature's contributions to people, including ecosystem functions and services, such as the regulation of air, water and climate, soil health, pollination and reduction of disease risk, as well as protection from natural hazards and disasters, through nature-based solutions and/or ecosystem-based approaches for the benefit of all people and nature.












Goals and Expectations

- Working Group focus: Ecosystem Restoration and Nature-based Solutions
- Policies targeted by the Working Group:
 - GLOBAL: Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) Target 2
 & Target 11
 - EU: EU Biodiversity Strategy, EU Nature Restoration Law (still pending)
 - MED: Barcelona Convention ICZM Protocol and SPA/BD Protocol, Post 2020 SAP BIO

Principles to Be Followed

- All GBF targets are somehow interlinked. Discussions should ensure integration
- Many policies not directly related to this Working Group enter in contradiction with its goals (i.e. urban development) and should be monitored as well
- Harmonisation of policies should be a goal of the Working Group discussions at
 Mediterranean scale, and at the various levels of governance (i.e. country vs. cities)
- Multilevel governance, specially the local context, should be also taken into account

 We already have MANY policies, most of the time, the problem lies in their implementation












Themes to Be Followed (I)

- Identification and assessment of existing barriers to restoration upscaling: strong planning and implementation processes should be in place, consider funding streams (for the long term) available to them, and engage with stakeholders to ensure that support for the restoration project is maintained and that benefits are distributed equitably.
- Landscape level restoration: How can it work in practice? Wetlands, seagrass, rivers and forests are priority ecosystems to focus on. An integrated and holistic approach should be taken to promote connectivity between












Themes to Be Followed? (II)

- Promote best available practices and knowledge sharing: Explore the technical, financial, policy/governance and socio-economic aspects of restoration and the available nature-based solutions that can implemented.
- Identify priority areas to expand restoration actions in the Mediterranean through ongoing projects/initiatives from our networks? The EU Nature Restoration Law mentions favourable reference areas to support restoration.











What Should We Do?

- Increase knowledge on the subject matter at all levels of governance.
 - Materials/approach should be target-specific (national vs regional vs city, etc.).
- Provide material, information, ideas, contacts, speakers and expertise to implement capacity building actions and to communicate with resources that already exist.
- Act as a platform to reward good practices and promote good work: taking into account declining habitats
