

THE ISSUE AT STAKE

Morine litter - and marine plastic pollution in particular - is a major threat due to its significant environmental, economic, social, political and cultural implications. Marine litter negatively impacts coastal and marine ecosystems and the services they provide, ultimately affecting people's livelihoods and well-being. Marine plastic pollution is not just an oceans' pollution issue. It is an air pollution and climate issue too as plastic - admittedly an indispensable material of todays'

societies - contributes to greenhouse gas emissions at every stage of its lifecycle, from its production to its refining and up to the way it is managed as a waste product.

Plastic pollution in the Mediterranean Sea poses a threat to countries' wellbeing, economic resilience and environmental sustainability, with potential effects on human health yet to be





nerable to pressures from its densely populated beaches appear to originate primarily from rec-

as estimated in 2015, are at the level of over 260,000 tonnes per year or 730 tonnes per day, depending on the coastal population, which may vary depending on the country, representing more than 2% of the total inputs in the world's oceans (UNEP/MAP, 2015).

The root causes of marine litter in the Mediterranean are the same as anywhere else in the world: a complex combination of production and consumption patterns, irresponsible behavior of individuals and economic sectors, weak enforcement and/or lock of policy and legislative frameworks, poor solid waste management practices, misconceptions related to possible solutions, fragmented understanding of the problem due to the lack of fit-for-purpose data.

Overall, the Mediterranean economy is still marked by a linear system, which over-exploits natural resources, causes pollution and thus undermines fragile ecosystems: in a region considered a hi

the resilience of the economic system. It also constitutes a lever to help achieve the UN 2030 Agenda and several of its SDGs.

Within this context, PLASTIC BUSTERS is continuously and concretely consolidating and advancing actions towards a litter-free Mediterranean.



The new **Pact for the Mediterranean**, that will pave the way towards a common space of peace, prosperity and stability in the Mediterranean region, building on the foundations of the 2021 Agenda for the Mediterranean. The Commission, in collaboration with the Union for the Mediterranean, will support the development of a blue economy sea-basin strategy on the Eastern Mediterranean, which currently lacks a dedicated structure for cooperation, based on the format of the WestMed Initiative and in cooperation with existing regional bodies.

Built around six strategic objectives

- ✓ Protecting and restoring ocean health
- ✓ Boosting the competitiveness of the EU sustainable blue economy
- ✓ Supporting coastal and island communities, and outermost regions
- ✓ Advancing ocean research, knowledge, skills and innovation
- ✓ Enhancing maritime security and defence
- ✓ Strengthening EU ocean diplomacy and international ocean governance
